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Confirmed COVID-19 Cases

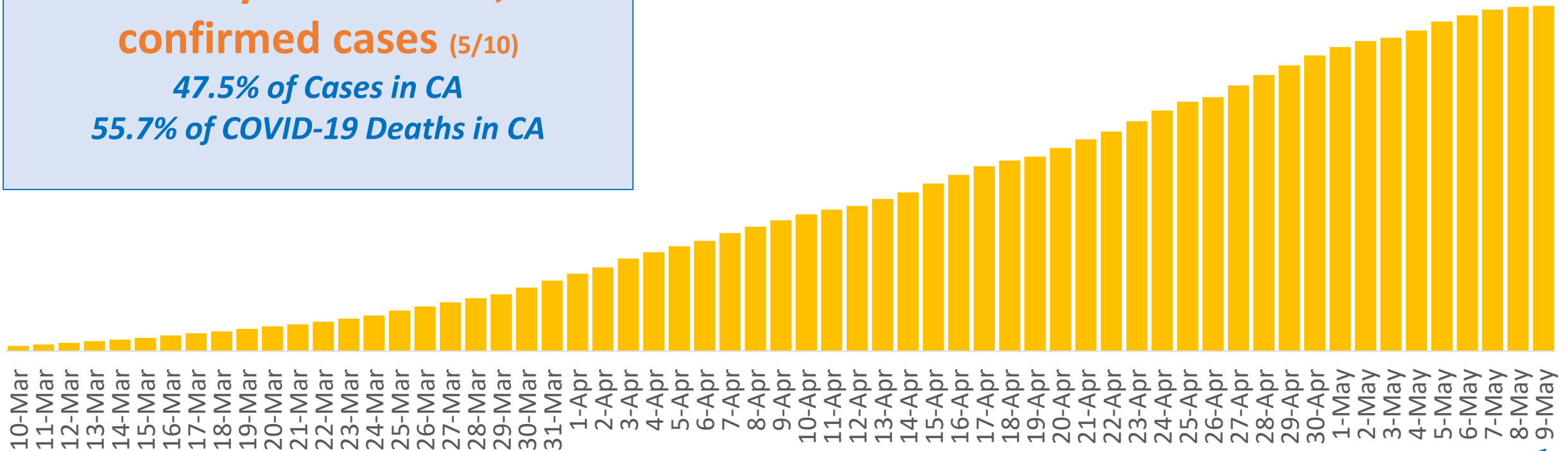
in LA County (5/10)

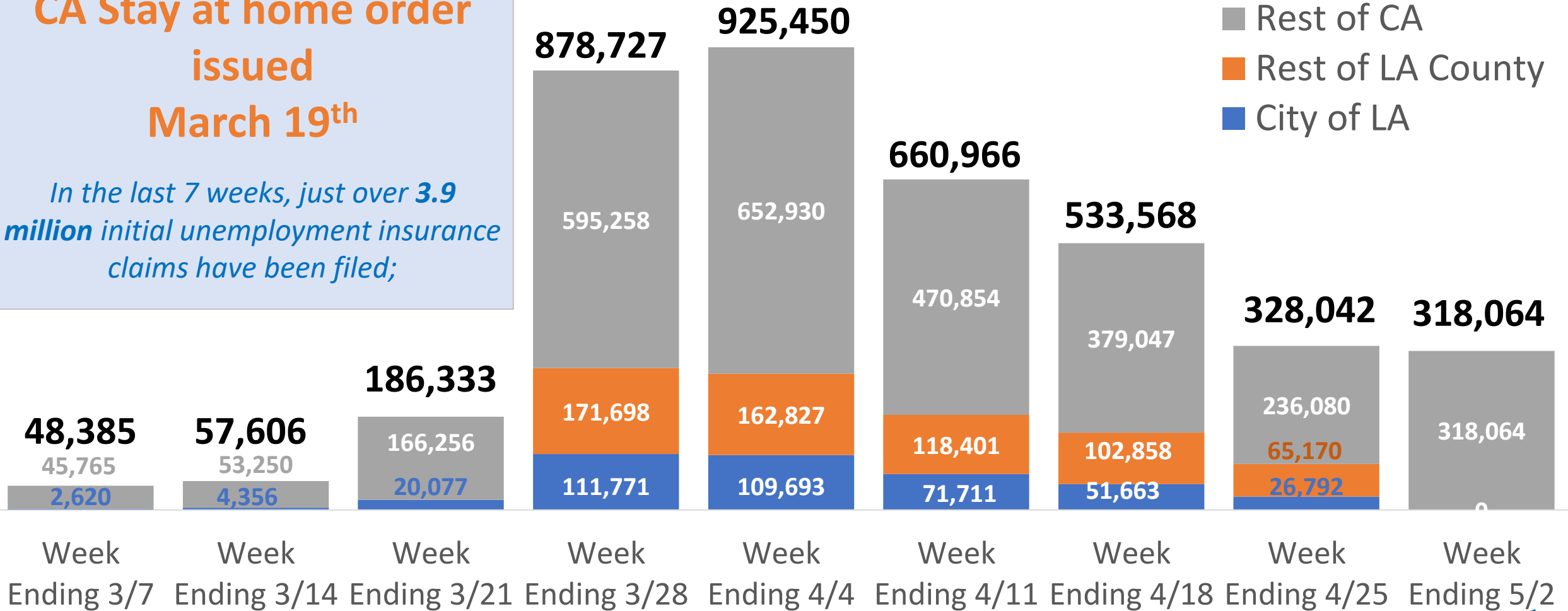


Unemployment Insurance Weekly Claims in CA

CA Stay at home order issued March 19th

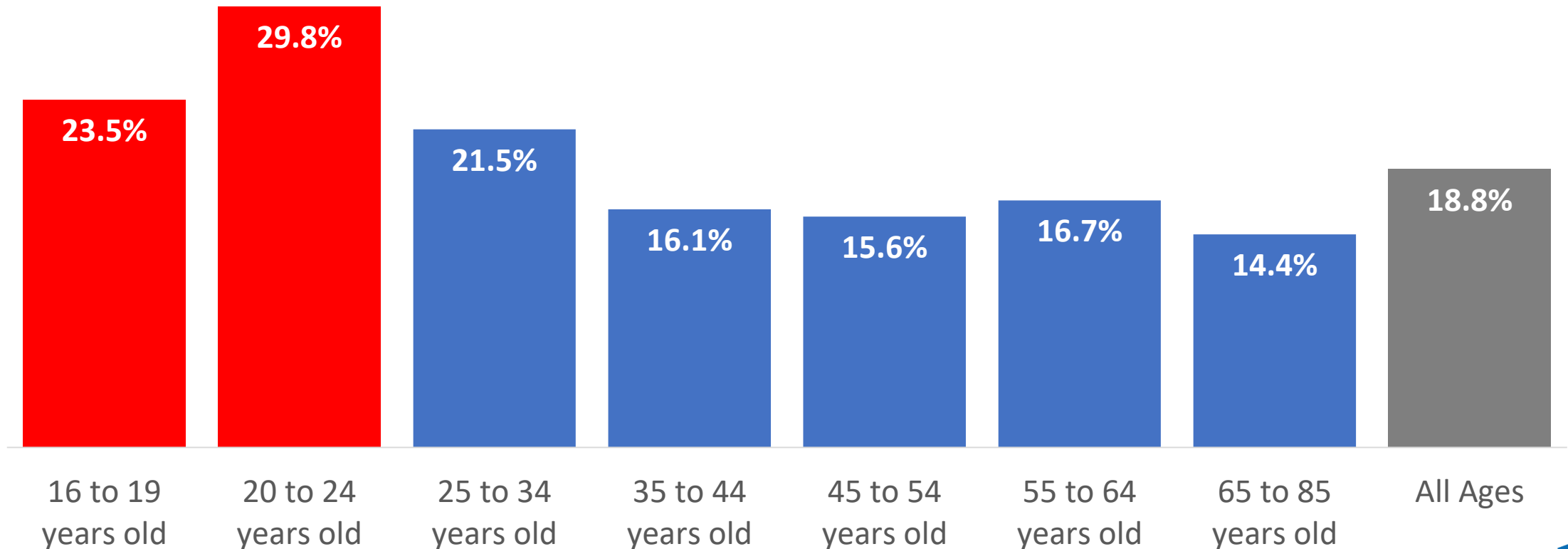
In the last 7 weeks, just over 3.9 million initial unemployment insurance claims have been filed;

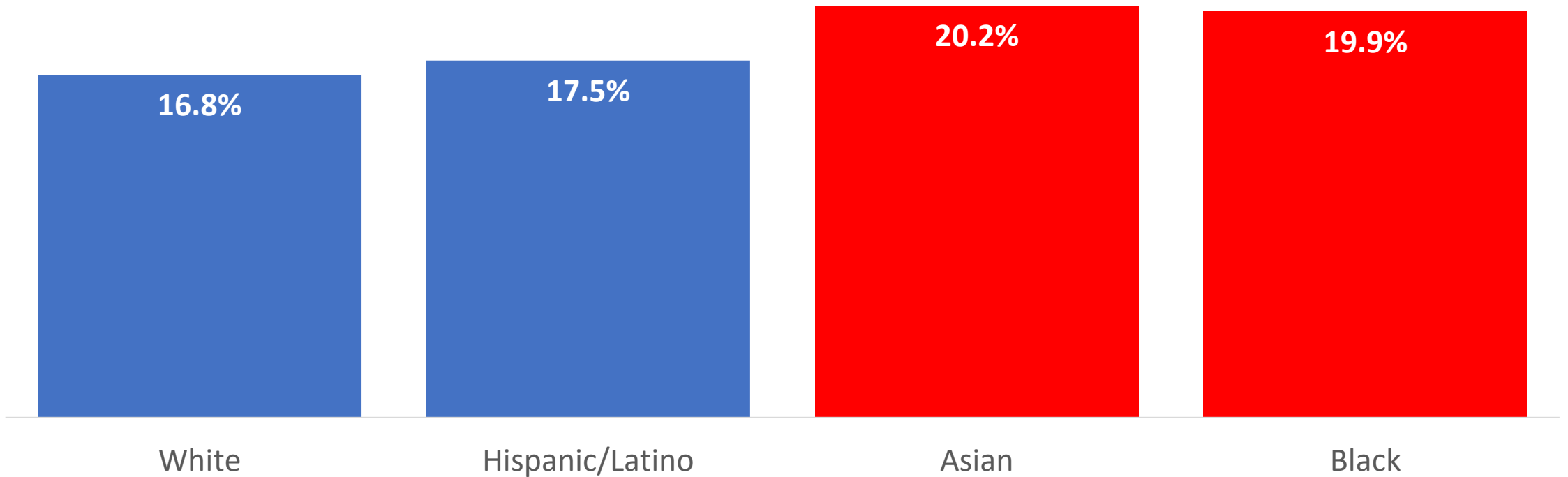
COVID-19 in CA: By Age

UI Claims as a Share of the Cohort's Labor Force from Mid-March to April 25th



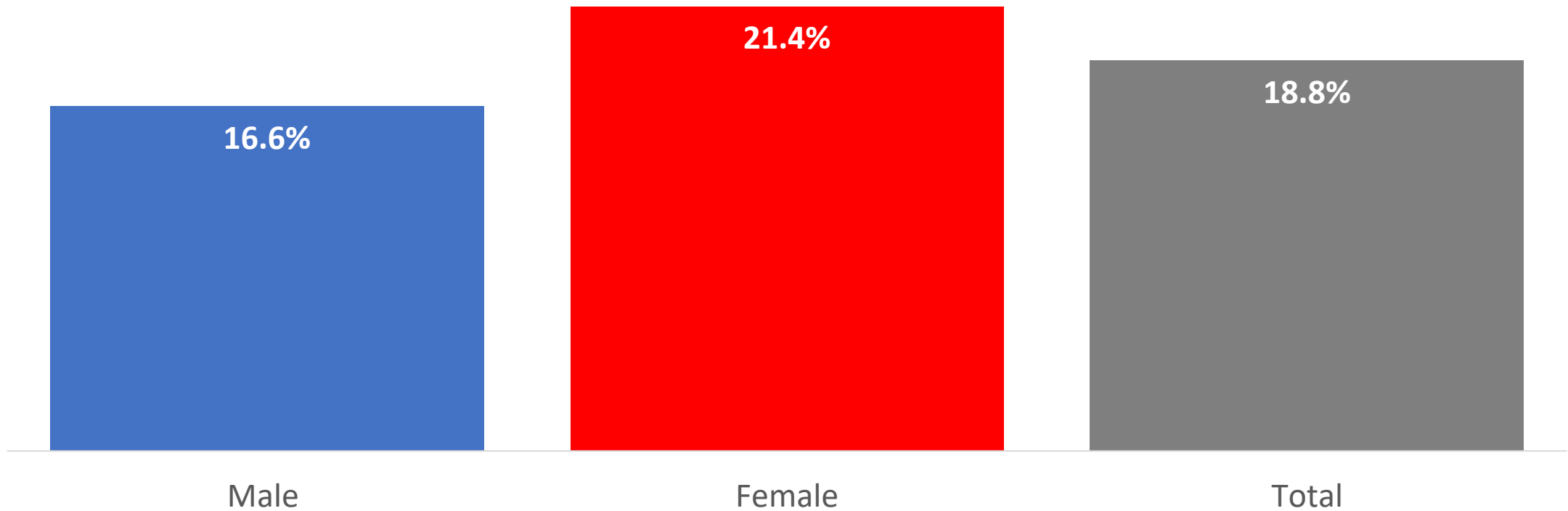
COVID-19 in CA: By Race and Ethnicity

UI Claims as a Share of the Cohort's Labor Force from Mid-March to April 25th



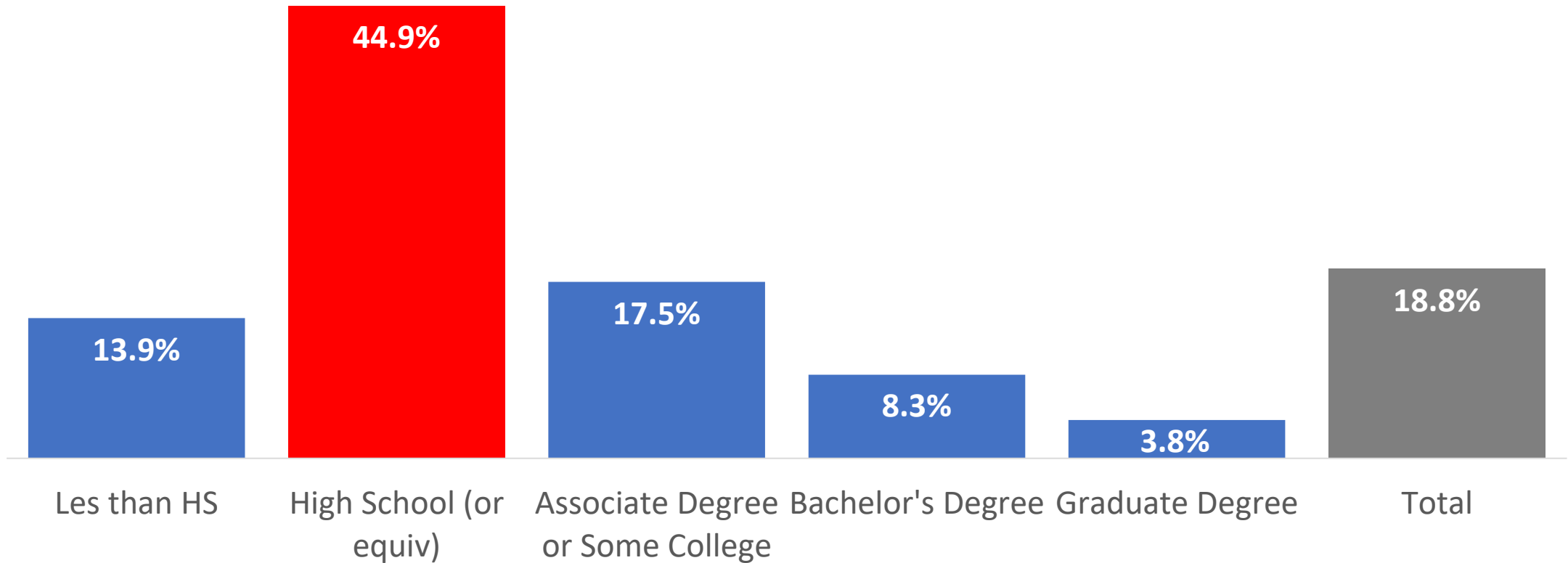
COVID-19 in CA: By Gender

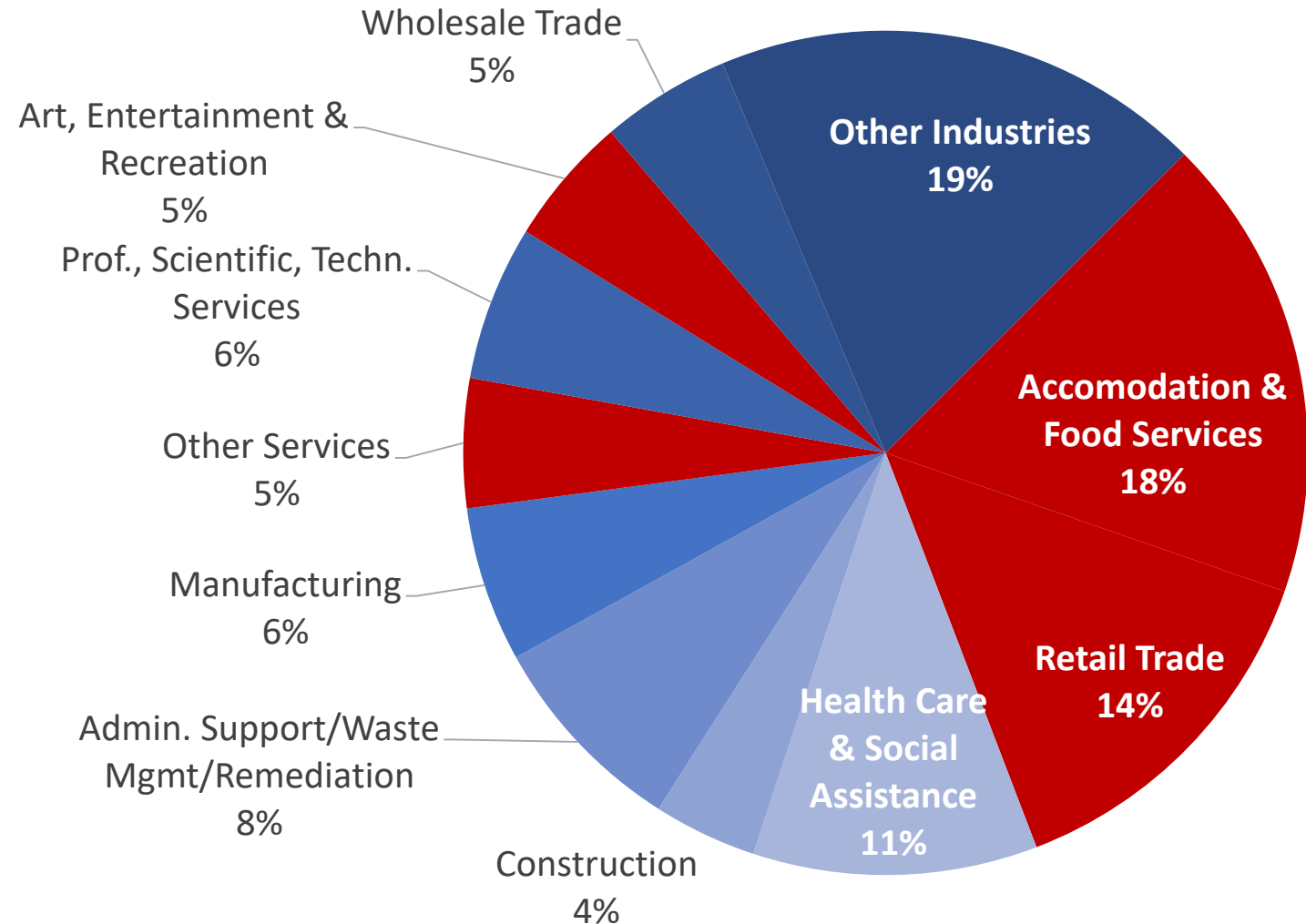

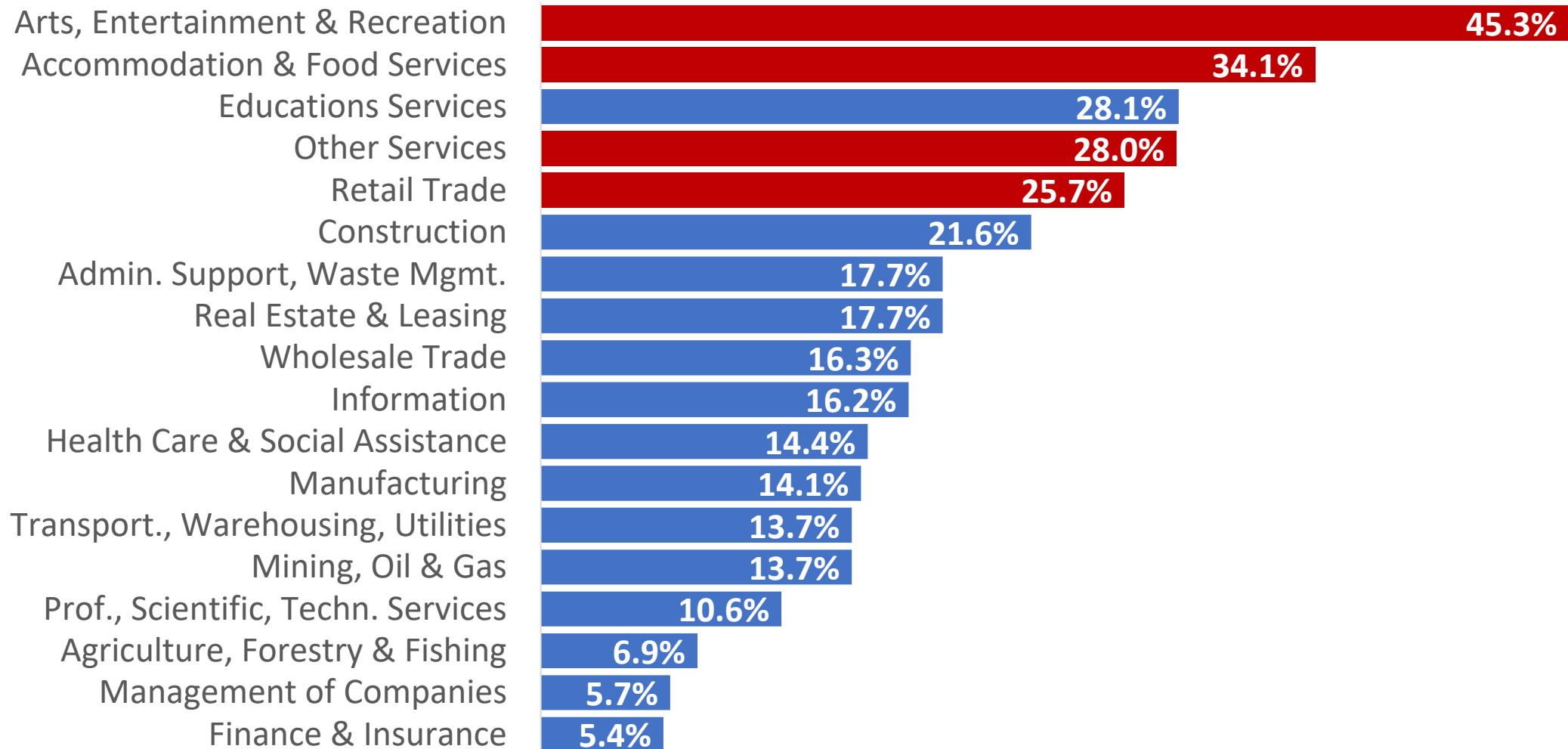

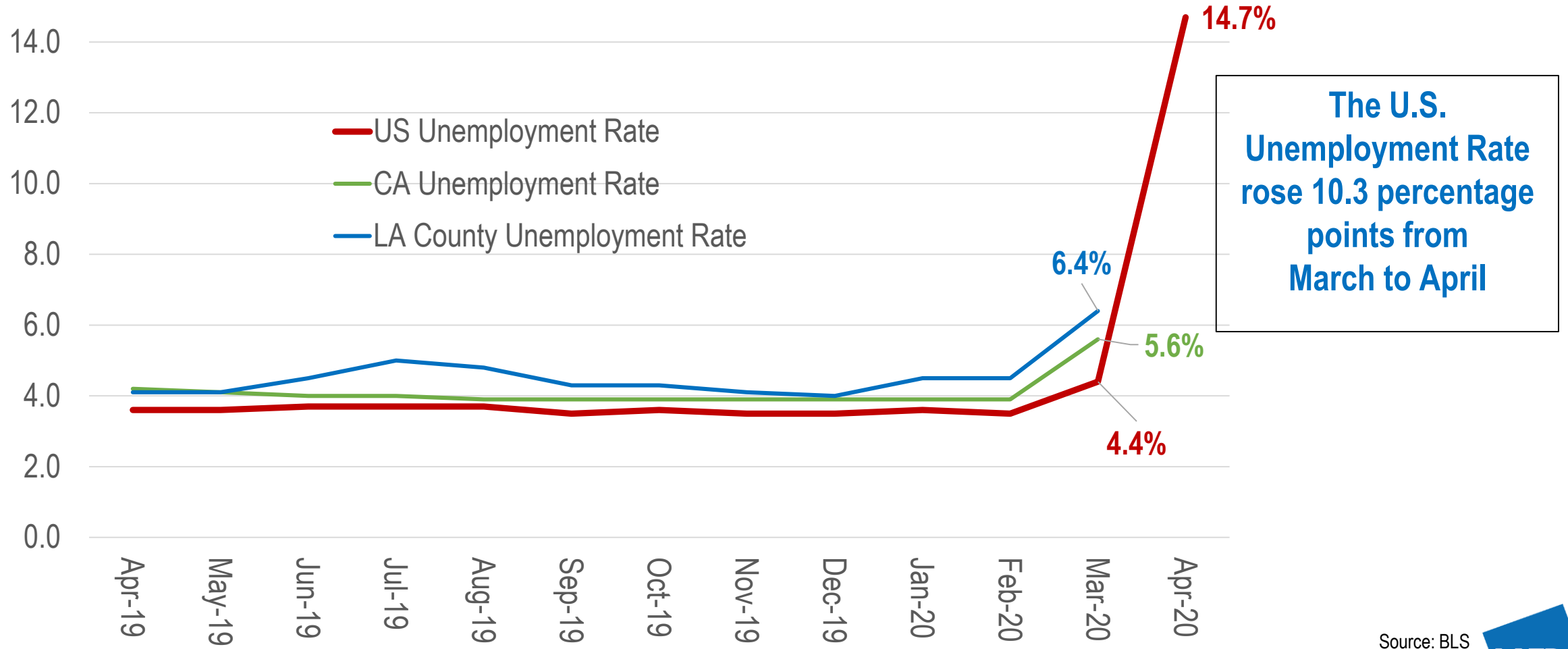
COVID-19 in CA: By Industry

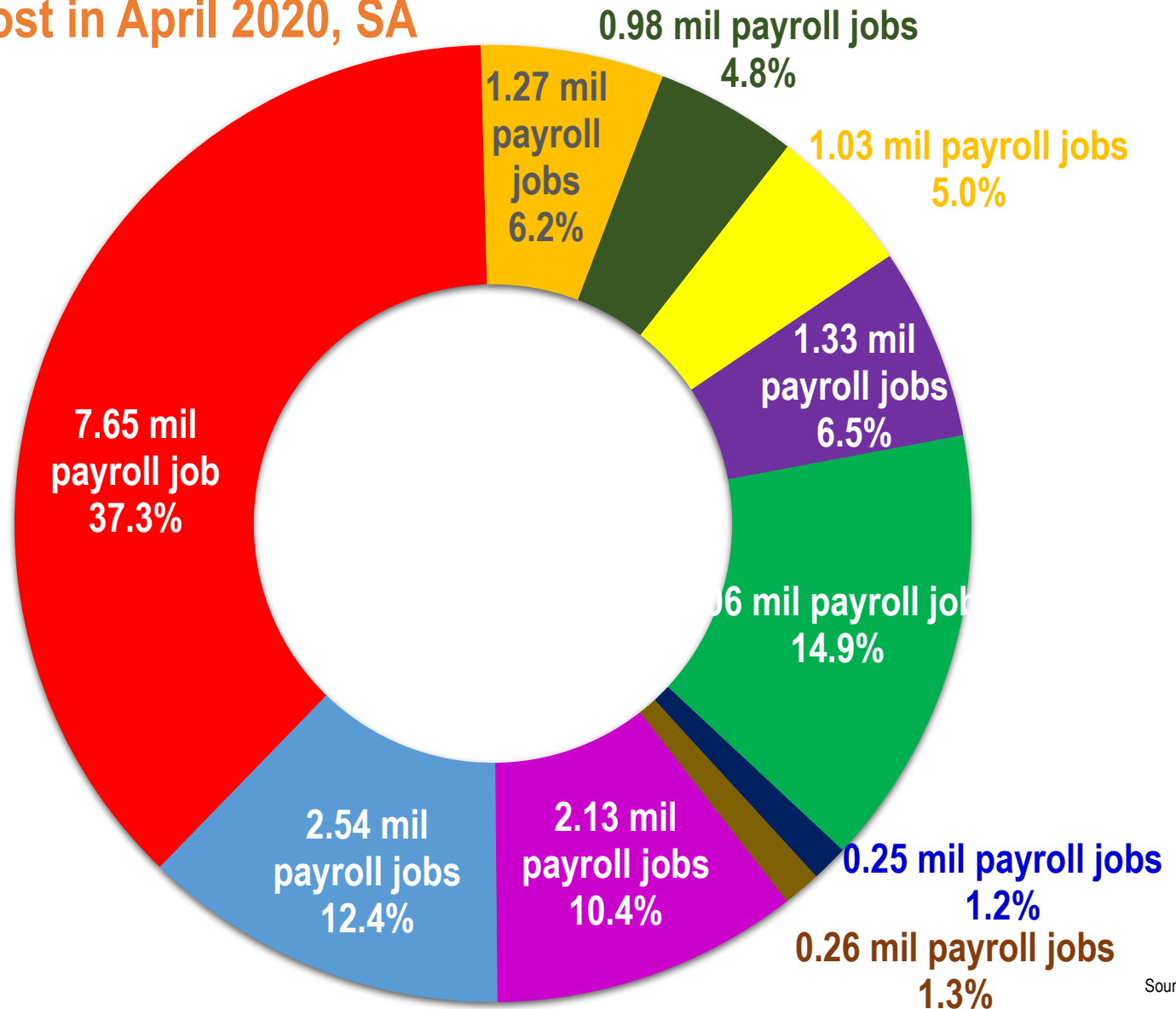

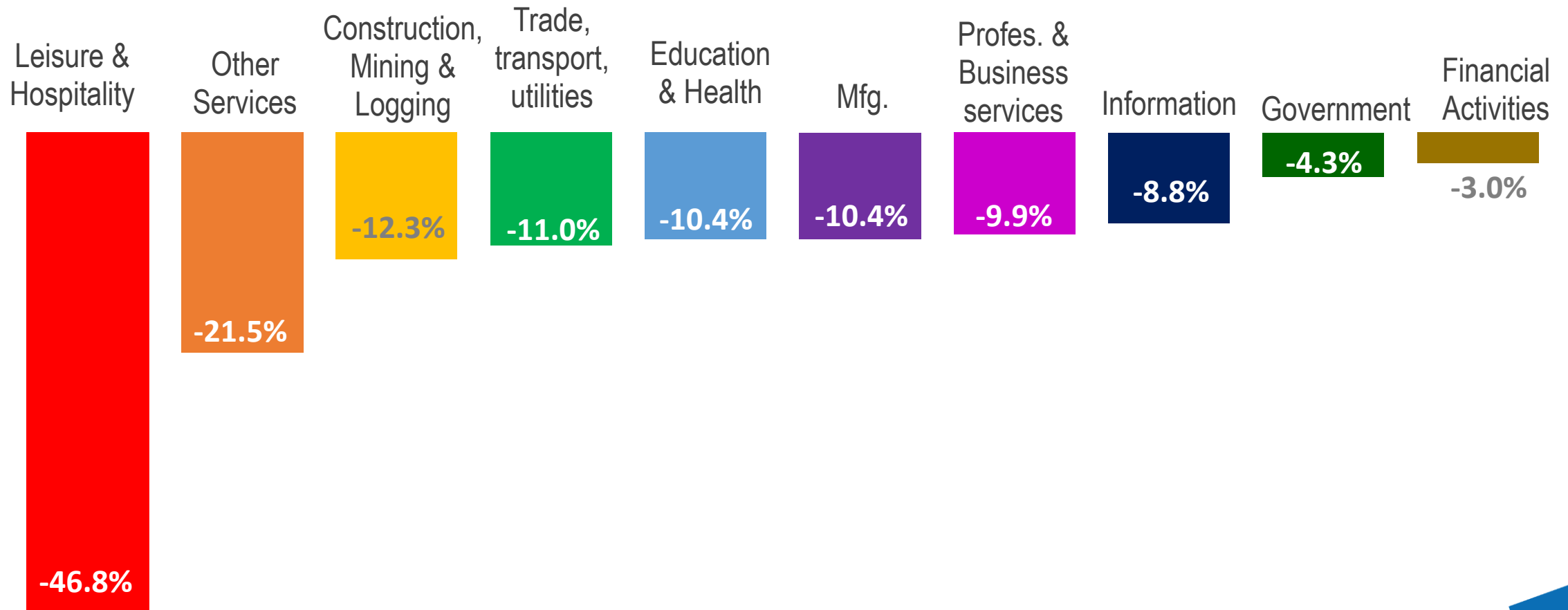

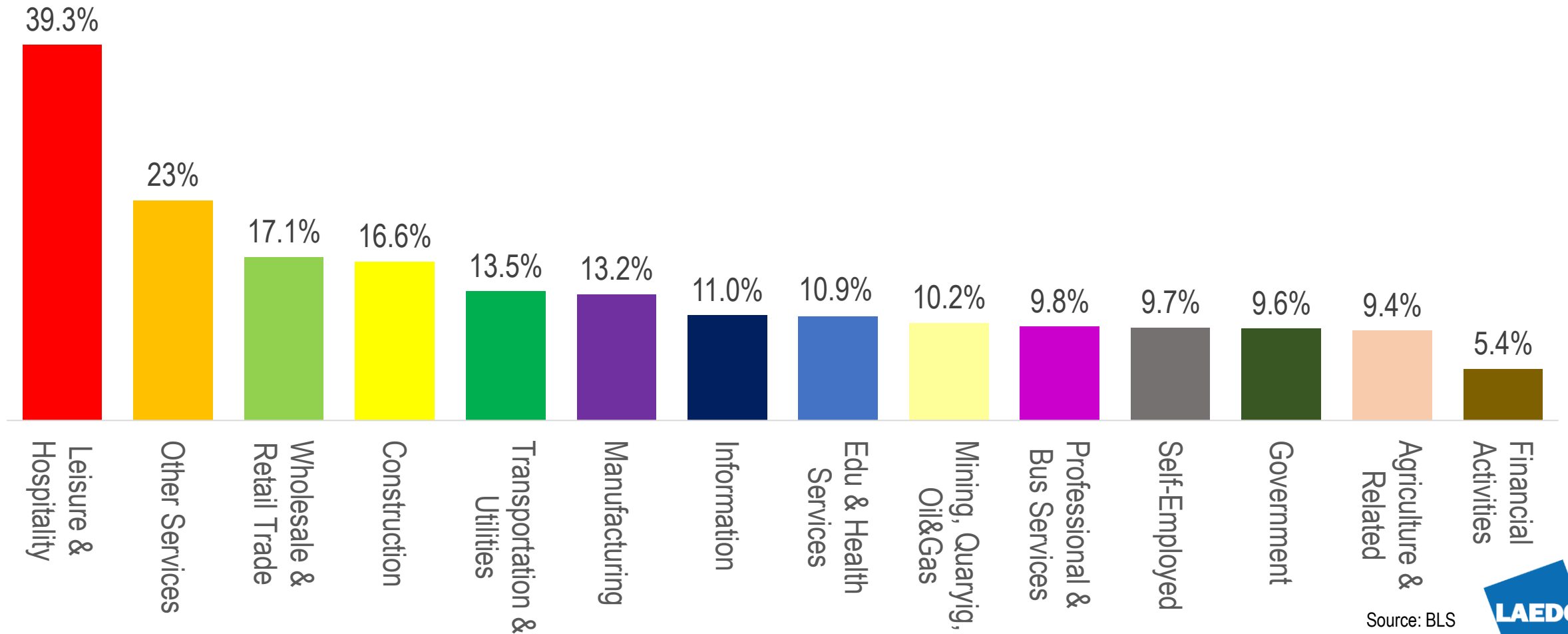
Monthly Change in US Payroll Employment by Sector

US Unemployment Rates & Unemployed Persons by Industry

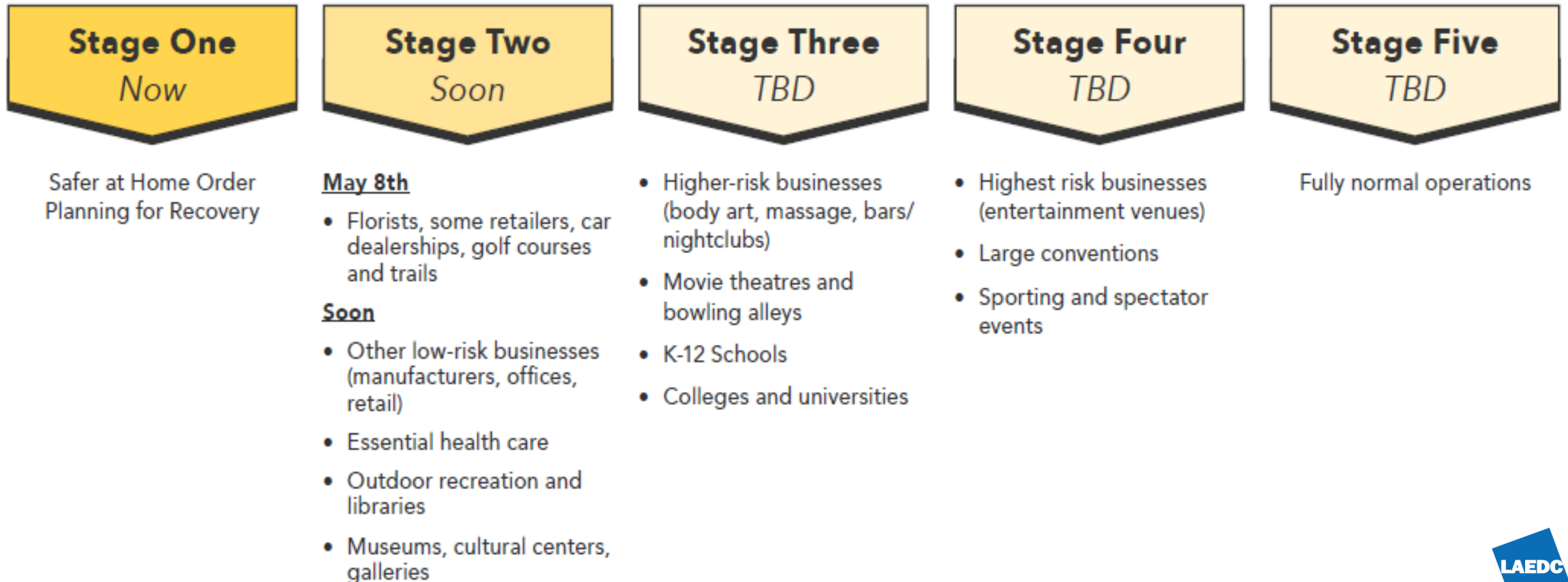

Five-Stage Reopening Process Based On Risk

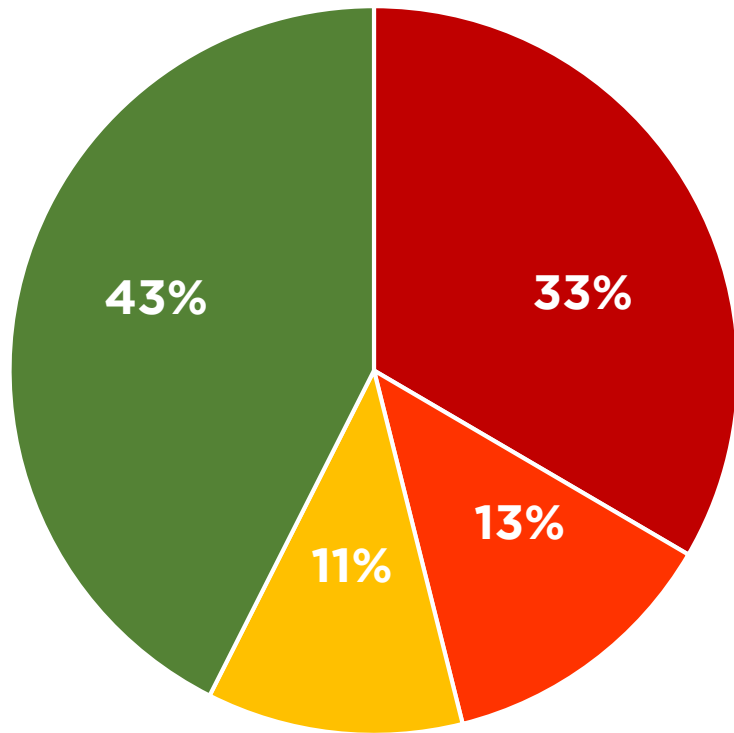

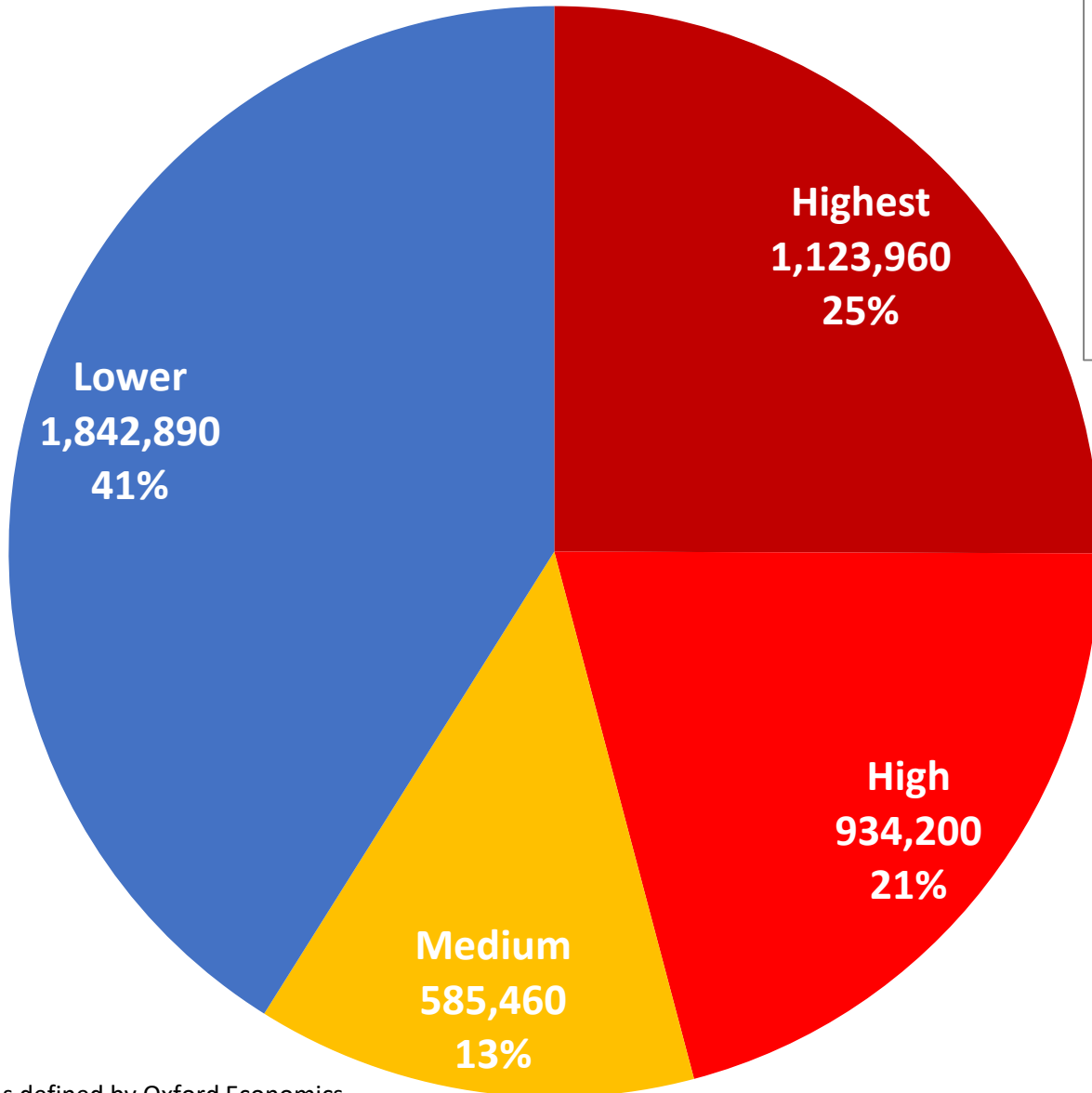
Unit elastic (neither elastic or inelastic):

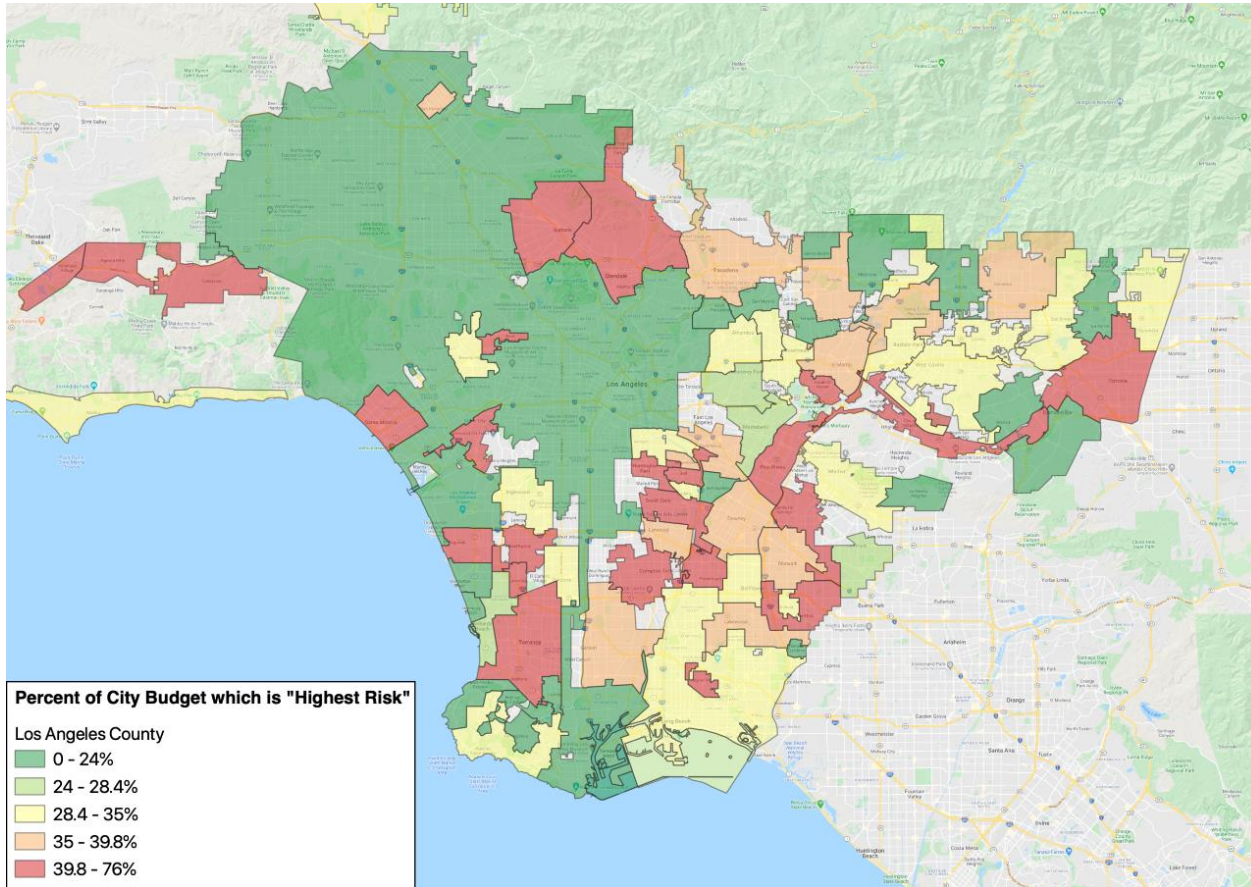

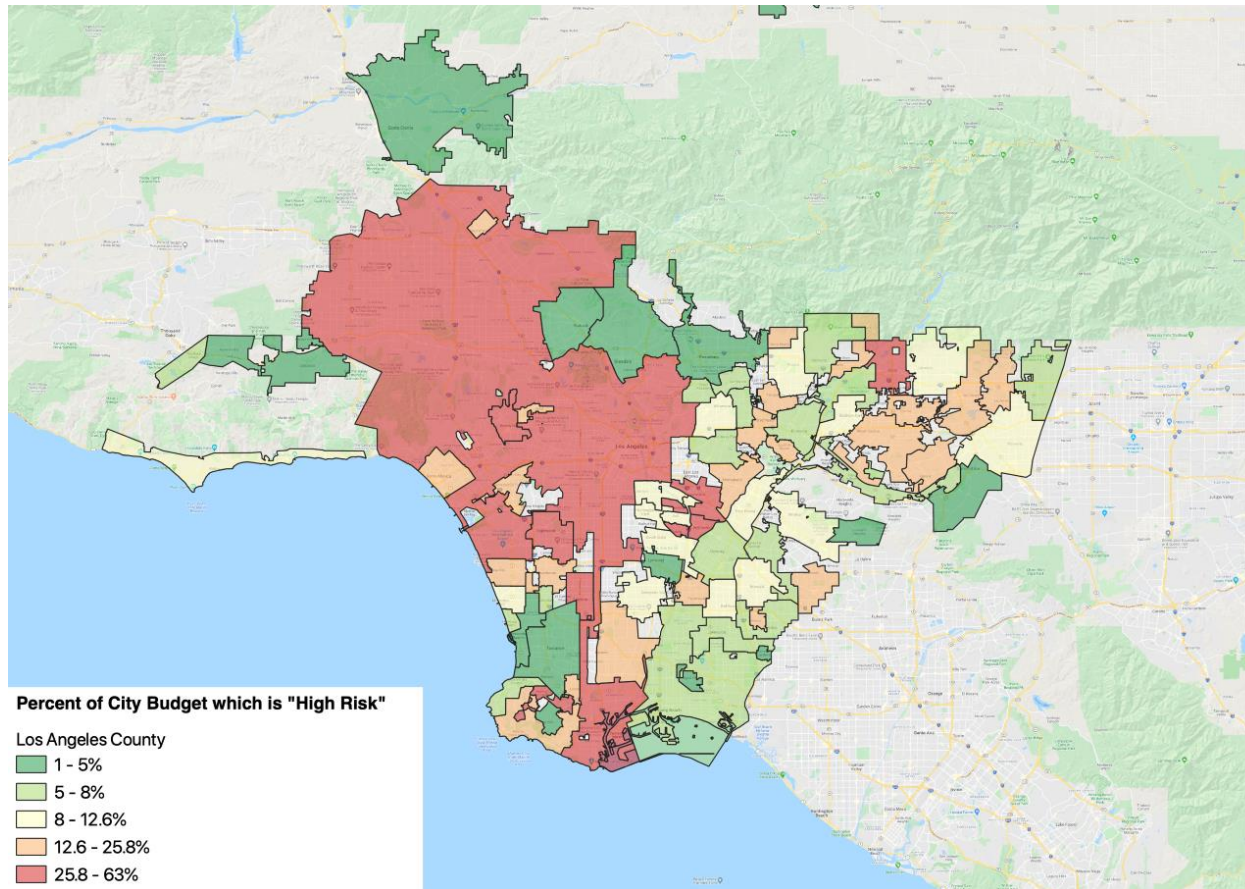

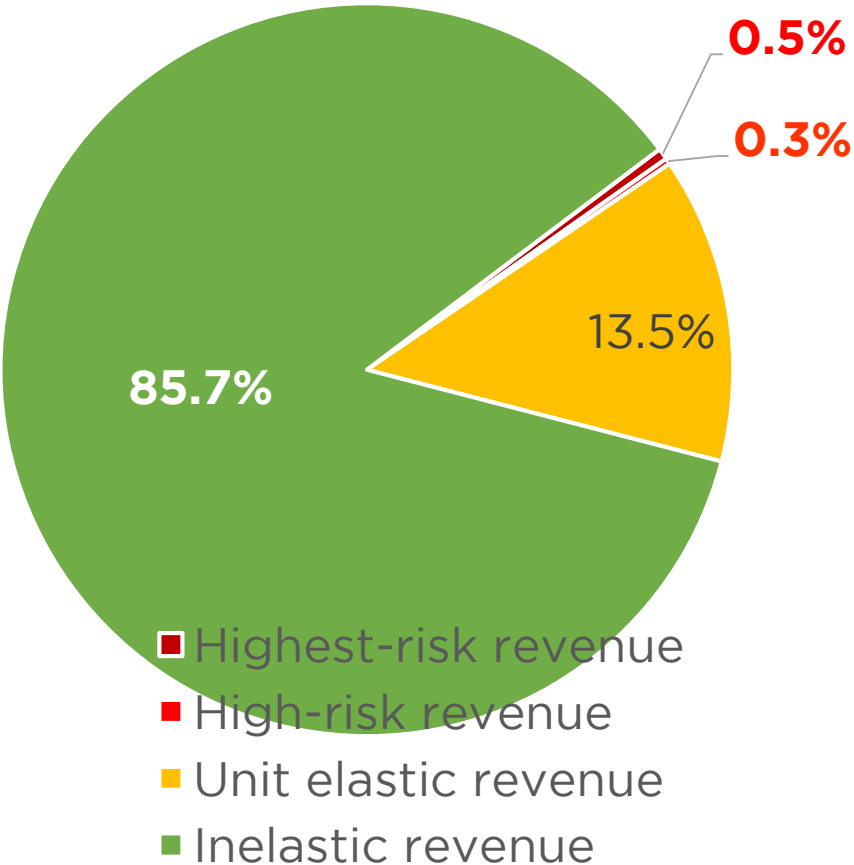

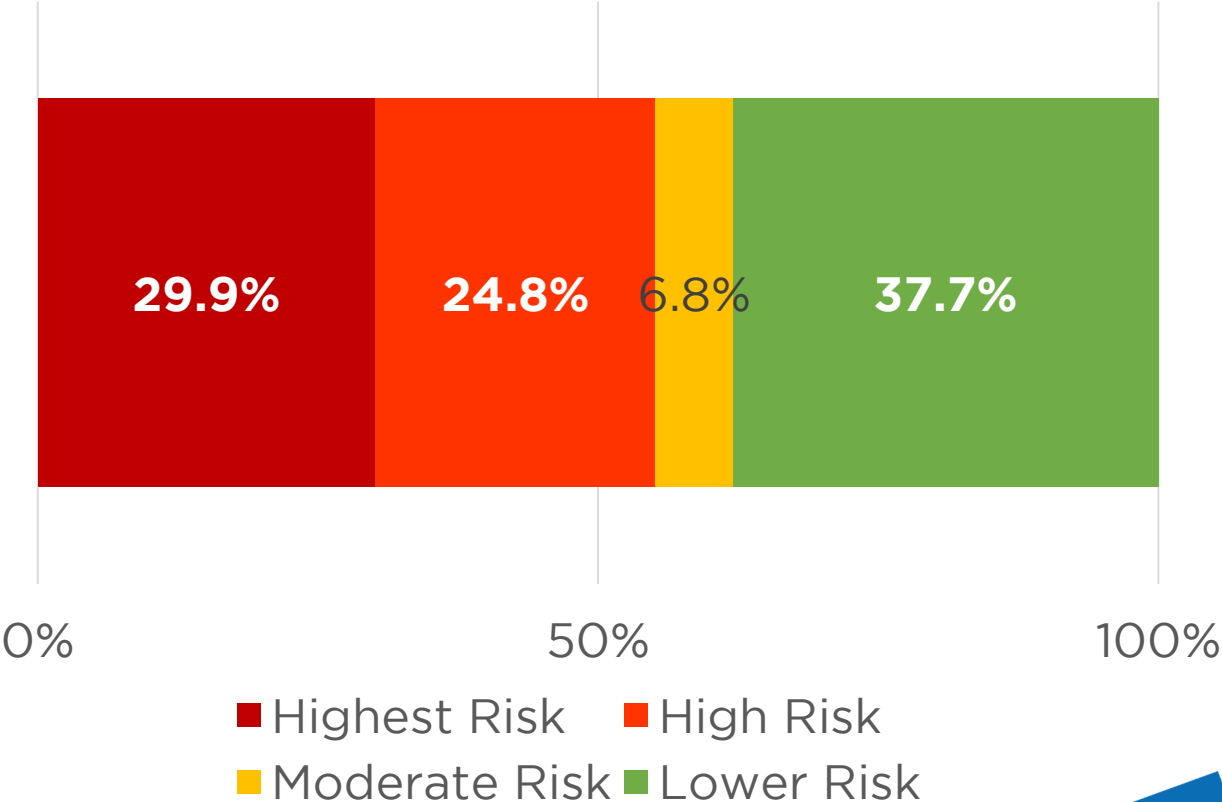
