



#### Age, Race and Ethnicity of Workers in Very High Risk Industries


Race & Ethnicity of Workers in LA County Age of Workers in LA County

# High Risk Job Shares in LA County


Share of Total Jobs Identified as High and Very High Risk by Service Planning Area







#### CA Stay at home order issued March 19th


- In the last 8 weeks, just over **4.0 million** initial unemployment insurance claims have been filed.
- Between April 28th and May 9th, an additional 298,00 new PUA claims have been processed.
- From 3/14 to 5/2, The CA EDD paid more than a third of what was paid in benefits during the highest year of

demand during the last recession, which was \$22.9 billion in calendar year 2010.




#### COVID-19: UI Claims in CA: By Age




#### COVID-19: UI Claims in CA: By Race & Ethnicity




#### Distribution of Total UI Claims from Mid-March to April 25th

Total Initial UI Claims in LA County from Mid-March to April 25<sup>th</sup>:






#### COVID-19: UI Claims in CA: By Industry

Projected Number of Jobs Lost by Occupational Group, May 2020 (jobs in 000s)





Weekly Hotel Occupancy Rates in LA County 2020 versus 2019






Year-Over-Year Demand and Supply Growth in LA County Markets Most Affected

#### Weekly Lodging in Los Angeles County for the Week Ending May 9, 2020








